# ABOUT OPERATION SMILE THAILAND

Operation Smile is an international medical charity whose global network of thousands of credentialed medical volunteers from over 80 countries is committed to helping improve the health and lives of children from more than 38 countries. Since its inception in 1982, Operation Smile has worked with local medical professionals, governments, hospitals and other NGOs to deliver the safest care to all patients, and have established care centers wherever possible to give children ongoing medical treatment. Operation Smile continues to provide training and education for local medical professionals so they can provide care within their own communities and share their expertise. To date, we have provided more than 314,000 free surgeries for children born with cleft lip, cleft palate and other facial deformities around the world.

In 1997, Operation Smile hosted its first mission in Thailand with great support from the former Prime Minister, H.E. Mr. Anand Panyarachun. In 2001, Operation Smile Thailand was registered and established as an official charitable medical foundation to provide help to low-income patients in remote rural areas across Thailand. Since 1997, we have provided more than 15,121 life-changing surgeries in Thailand and neighbor countries, thanks to the tireless devotion of our medical volunteers, non-medical volunteers and our staff.

Operation Smile has created a long-term plan to provide educational opportunities to our in-country medical volunteers to help strengthen the local healthcare infrastructure in Thailand. This will benefit the planning of medical treatment for patients with cleft lip and cleft palate, as well as patients suffering from severe burn injuries - another area of our expertise. These educational programs range from international medical conferences that involve the exchanging and sharing of new techniques and knowledge, to training programs for medical professionals such as international life support trainings, which are made possible by being a global partner with the American Heart Association.

At Operation Smile our medical volunteers generously donate their time, knowledge and skills to help children born with facial deformities receive free medical treatment they could not otherwise afford. Our volunteers are driven by one goal: provide children around the world with highest surgical care. Operation Smile Thailand has more than 400 medical volunteers who are well-respected among their peers.

The Student Programs structure empowers youth, creating a global movement for positive change through Operation Smile's four pillars of philanthropy: Leadership, Education, Service and Awareness.

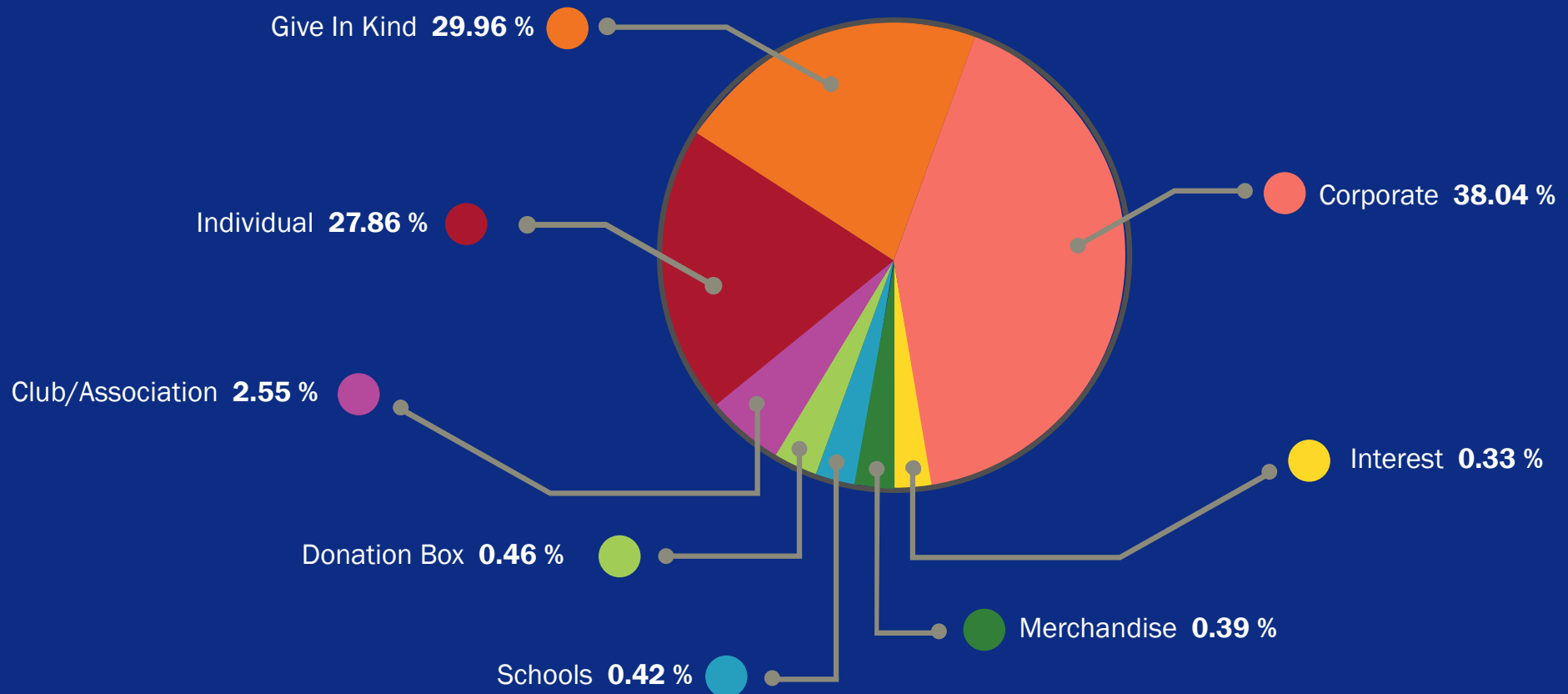
